

Agency goes back to being independent

Staff promise to bring that personal touch

A LETTINGS agency in Beaconsfield has returned to its independent status after 14 years.

Tennysons has taken over from the former Frank Farr Halifax Estate Agency in Burkes Road.

It is headed by Philip Suter who, in 1984, set up the agency after incorporating his High Wycombe based residential lettings business into Frank Farr & Sons.

In 1989 Frank Farr & Sons became part of Property Leeds (UK) Ltd, the estate agency subsidiary of the Leeds Permanent Building Society.

With the merger of The Leeds and Halifax building societies, Frank Farr became

part of Halifax Estate Agencies Ltd.

Lisa Robinson and Shirley Walker, both of whom have been at the Beaconsfield office for many years, have joined Mr Suter in the new venture.

Mr Suter added: "Going independent now brings that personal touch which we feel is the most important asset when caring for someone else's home.

Tennysons currently has some 90 properties under full management in an area of around a 15-mile radius of Beaconsfield.

The agency is offering

three levels of service – finding a tenant, rent collection and full management, backed by computerised accounting in compliance with guidelines laid down by the Association of Residential Letting Agents.

Mr Suter added: "We are concerned only with residential lettings and management on behalf of the owners and tenants.

"A great deal of our business comes via company relocations and contacts with overseas personnel built up through the years of service from the staff of this office."
