ST. Margaret's Church, Uxbridge, was filled on Saturday afternoon for the wedding of Miss Ruth Marjorie Suter, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. G. A. Suter, of "Kithia," Norfolk-road, Uxbridge, and Mr. Alexander Thomas Maitland, of 132 Manor-way, Uxbridge.

The bride, who like her mother takes an active interest in British Red Cross work, is a member of the Chartered Society of Physiotherapy. She is a state-registered nurse, holding the orthopaedic nursing certificate, and she is at present a physiotherapist at Hillingdon Hospital.

The bridegroom, also a native of Uxbridge, is employed by an engineering firm in London. He shares the bride's interest in the Red Cross.

The bride, who was given away by her father, Mr. G. A. Suter, wore a dress of white lace and train, with a head-dress of white lilac with short tulle veil. She carried a shower bouquet of Rosalindi roses, sweet peas and stephanotis.

In attendance were Miss Elizabeth Suter, bride's sister, and Miss Joyce Maitland, bridegroom's sister, in ballerina length dresses of rosebud design on white background with pink velvet sashes and head-dresses to match.

The choral service, conducted by the Rev. Harold Dunning, opened with the hymn "Praise my soul the King of Heaven."

Mr. Neville Craven was best man.

A peal of bells acclaimed the marriage and the ceremony closed with the hymn "Love divine all loves excelling."

The wedding reception was held in St. Margaret's Hall, where floral decorations had been arranged by Mrs. Lovibond and other friends. Here over two hundred guests were received, including the Deputy Mayor, Ald. J. Cochran, Dr. O. C. Dobson, Medical Officer of Health for Uxbridge, and other representative people.

During the cake-cutting ceremony the bride was presented with a bouquet on behalf of the staff of Messrs. Suters Ltd. and many congratulatory telegrams were received.

The health of the bride was proposed by her uncle, Mr. W. C.

Suter. After the reception the couple left for an unknown destination.

Mr. and Mrs. Suter's 25-year-old son George is to be married next week to Miss Janet Mack's, of Bristol.

Mr. Suter, who has been studying agriculture at the Royal Agricultural College where he took a diploma, will live on a 150-acre farm near Beckley, Northants, a wedding present from his father.
