ONE of the longest-serving members of Uxbridge Rotary Club and a well-known local businessman, John Suter, has died a month short of his 91st birthday.

Mr Suter joined Rotary in 1934, was president from 1948-49 and was still attending the Friday lunches at Uxbridge Civic Centre until earlier this month.

He worked for the family department store, Suters Ltd, which had branches in Slough and Uxbridge, for more than 40 years from the 1930s. He was chairman of the board for six years until it was taken over by Owen Owen in 1978.

Mr Suter, who lived in Uxbridge until 1948, died peacefully in the early hours of Friday at the Nuffield Nursing Home, Wexham.

John Randall, Uxbridge MP, who owns a family business, Randalls, in Vine Street, Uxbridge, said: "John Suter was a distinguished gentleman, one of a disappearing breed. He was part of Uxbridge's John Suter, businessman and Rotarian, history.
