During World War II he served in the RAF and was demobilised in 1946 with the rank of Flight Lieutenant.

He was the longest serving active member of Uxbridge Rotary Club, joining in 1934, and in 1989 he received Rotary's Paul Harris award the highest honour Rotary can make.
