

LEDBURY NAVAL HERO WOUNDED.

Mr. and Mrs. G. W. Suter, of West View, Ledbury, have received the following notification of their eldest son having been wounded, from the Record Office, Royal Naval Division, London: "I regret to inform you that your son, Able Seaman George Arthur Suter, London Z, 350, R.N.V.R., who was serving in the Howe Battalion, 2nd R.N. Brigade R.N. Division, is reported by telegram as having been wounded in action whilst serving with the Mediterranean Expeditionary Force, on the 31st December, 1915." Able Seaman George Arthur Suter joined the Royal Naval Division whilst in business in London, on September, 1914. In the first place he was attached to the Benbow Battalion, which was subsequently disbanded, and then he was transferred to the Howe Battalion, landing at the Dardanelles on June 1st last. Last summer he suffered from dysentery and yellow jaundice, and was in hospital at Cairo and Helwan two months. When he was fit he returned to the Dardanelles.
