

RUGBY PLAYER FIGHTS OFF JEMMY MAN

Police Cordon Store

MR. THOMAS SUTER, 26-year-old executive of a Slough High-street drapery store, disturbed two men who had just blown open a safe in the stores office.

As Mr. Suter, 5ft. 10in. Slough Rugby player, entered the smoke-filled room one of the men attacked him with a jemmy.

Mr. Suter grabbed a fire extinguisher from a wall and held the man off with it. Then one of them threw a bag containing £30 in cash at him and the pair bolted.

Mr. Suter, who had slight arm injury, called the police. Thirteen police and detectives with two dogs cordoned off the store—Suter's, Ltd.—but the thieves escaped.

The men got away with only a few pounds in cash. They had blown open two small safes in the office, muffling the explosions with quilts from the store.
