THREE POLES SENT TO PRISON

With the aid of an interpreter, two Polish soldiers, Zbigniew Zietkowski (24) and Jan Baum (25), and a Polish sailor, Josef Gorzynski, pleaded guilty to breaking and entering the shop of Messrs. Suters, Ltd., at Slough, between 6th and 7th April, and stealing goods to the value of £161 3s. 7d. They stated they were paying a visit to Slough at the time and were all drunk.

A Polish officer described them as bad examples in the repatriation camp

in Scotland, where they had been stationed.

Zietkowski and Gorzynski, who wished an outstanding offence of office breaking at Reading to be taken into consideration, were sent to prison for 15 months, and Baum for 12 months.
